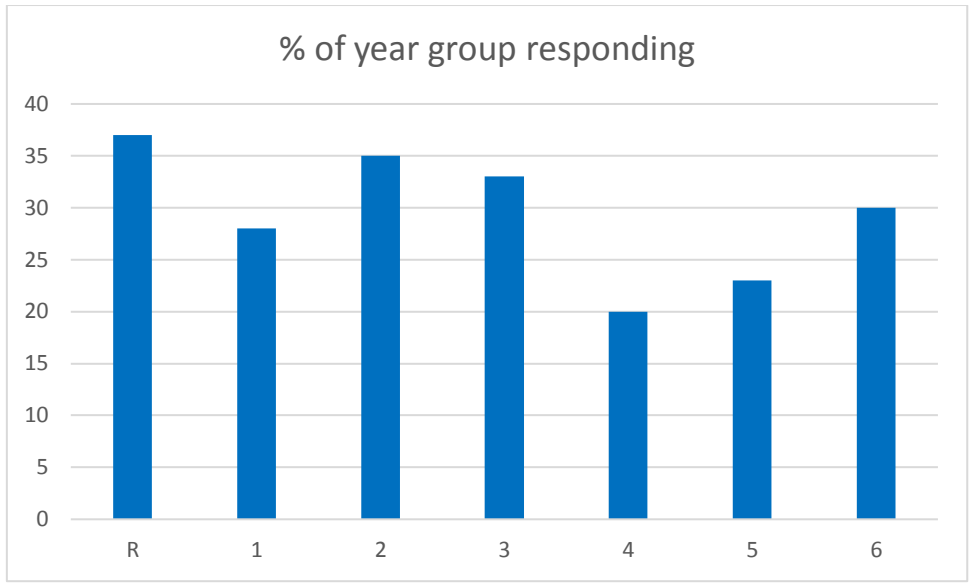


## Results of 2017 Parent Survey

### Summary and key findings

- There were 162 responses to the survey from a total of around 460 families with children at the school. All year groups were represented in the responses (varying from 20% to 37%).
- 90% of parents would be happy to recommend the school to other families.
- There was an overwhelmingly positive response to questions about children feeling happy, safe, being well looked after, taught well and making good progress.
- A small number of parents (7%) feel that we could communicate about children's progress more effectively and this will be discussed to ensure that all parents receive valuable updates. Please do ask if you feel that you need more information.
- Opinion is often divided on the topic of homework, but we were encouraged that only 10% of parents are not satisfied we are setting the correct amount.
- Less than 10% of parents were not satisfied that HTPD ensures its children are well behaved. This is something that we are always determined to address. Please do get in touch with me if you have specific concerns.
- Whilst concerns about bullying are uncommon, any child who experiences bullying is one too many. Again please do not hesitate to speak to me if you have any unresolved concerns.
- We were pleased that only 3% of respondents felt that HTPD did not respond well to their concerns. With an anonymous survey like this, it is obviously impossible to address individual concerns. However, please do contact me if the survey has raised any issues you would like to discuss further.
- We were grateful for so many individual comments about the Christian ethos of the school and were encouraged that so many parents valued how this impacts the children. Parents from all faiths and none reflected on how the children were being taught empathy, respect and love. Receiving feedback like this is so helpful as we plan for the school's ongoing distinctiveness.
- Thank you for all the useful comments, feedback and suggestions. The school governors and senior leaders will find them invaluable as we meet to consider the school development plan.
